

The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to needy children around the world, and together with the local church worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

OCC has a volunteer National Leadership Team in each receiving country. They manage the project locally including customs, transport & storage, liaison with communities, training and follow up after the distributions with discipleship.

SA & NT Shoebox Total: 18,673 (Went to Philippines) Australia/New Zealand total: 228,104 Internationally: 10,599,907 boxes were given to children worldwide.

# Goals for 2023

SA & NT Shoebox goal: 20,500 Australia/New Zealand goal: 250,000

OCC is all about sharing the Gospel

message with children around the world.

Where possible, the Gospel is presented at each shoebox distribution. Every child also receives a gospel booklet (The Greatest Gift).



Children are then invited to participate in a 12 week discipleship program, the Greatest Journey (TGJ).

Millions of children around the world have come to faith in Christ through OCC & TGJ.

Every 60 seconds, 4 children accept Jesus Every 60 seconds, 21 children hear the Gospel

# Not Allowed:

## Used / second hand clothing or toy

Vaseline®

Scary items (things that will frighten a child rather than bring joy)

War-related items (such as toy soldiers, military vehicles, or wearable camouflage)

Liquid paint sets or liquid glue

Rubber balls with liquid filling

Liquid lip gloss

Matches or fire starters

Seeds

Sand/rocks/shells gathered from nature

All types of food, candy, or gum

Medications or vitamins

Toothpaste

Nail polish

Money or play money

Baby powder

Baking soda

Razors

Liquids or lotions

Breakable items or glass containers

Aerosol cans

Bibles or other religious literature
