

On **Saturday 8th February at 10 am**, there will be a really interesting speaker at the **Church of Christ Mens' Morning Tea** called **Paul Symonds**. Paul has spent all his life in trouble spots in Africa and Asia trying to improve food production and distribution, funnelling enormous amounts of money from organisations like the European Commission into the most effective local government and private programs. And yet Africa remains poor .

So the question Paul will speak on is 'Why, when we have seen dramatic declines in poverty in China and India over the past 20 years, does Africa remain poor?'

Sometimes we need to hear what the real situation is. If we send money for a family to buy goats, or sink a well for clean water, we get to feel all warm and fuzzy, but what are the consequences in the real world over there?
